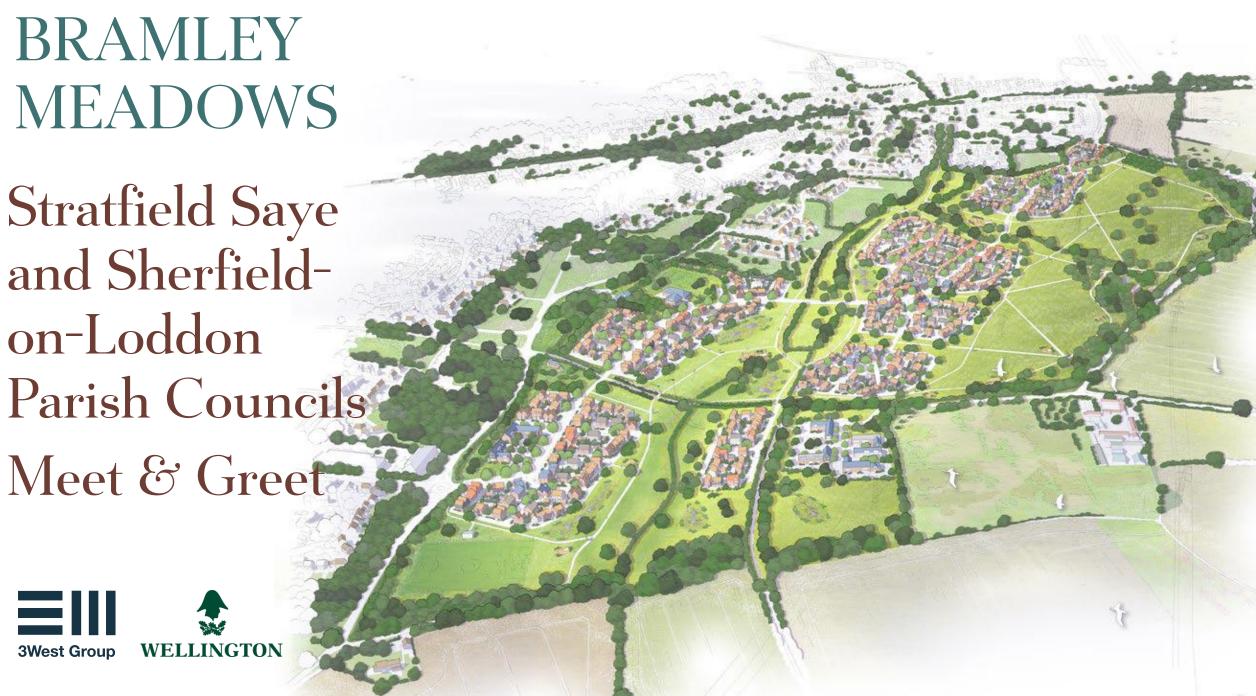

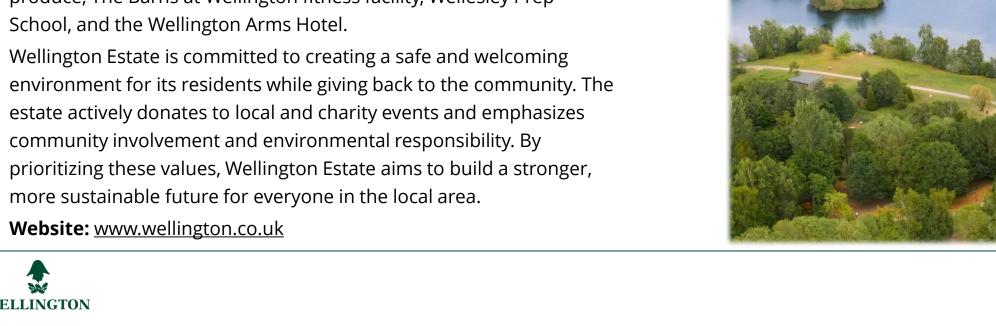






WELLINGTON ESTATE

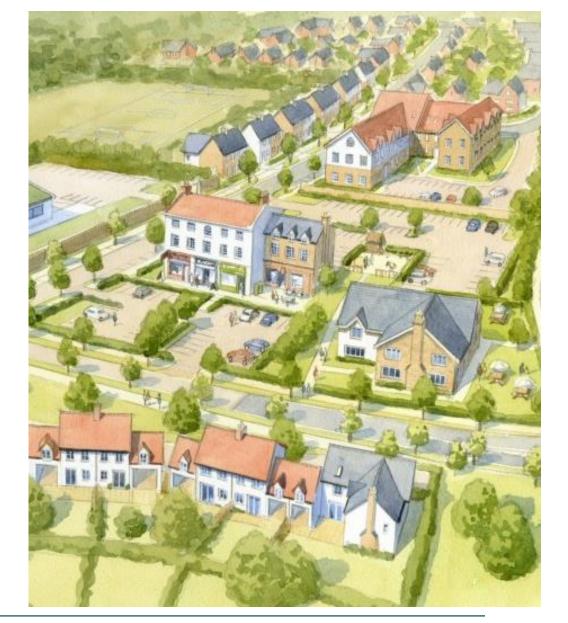

BNG / River Loddon	Additional land provision for BNG / river modelling instructed









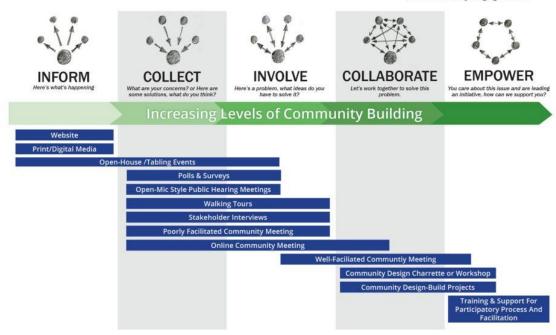
